"A Modern Parable"

Hear then the parable:

A virus descends on a small town, and the contagion soon overwhelms the entire community. As the hospital fills up and the death rate rises, the locals seek help. They gather in churches big and small, praying for the sick.

The town doctor stops by the churches to say, "There's a cure for this, let me help."

"No," the townsfolk reply, "We trust in God, not in science."

The death toll continues to climb. Now the people gather in their churches to pray for the sick and for the town's healthcare workers, who are beyond exhausted. A nurse comes by and says, "There's a simple fix for this, all you have to do is get vaccinated. Please do your part to care for others and for yourself."

"No," the townsfolk say, "We trust in God, not in science."

Now the people in the churches are deathly ill and their chances of being killed by this virus are disproportionately high, especially compared to the people outside the churches. Those with the strength to still gather continue to pray for the many people they know who are nearing death.

The doctors and nurses — who by now are utterly fatigued from trying to help combat the effects of this virus for well over a year — plead with the townsfolk to please do their part to eradicate this virus, letting the townsfolk know that 99% of those who die from this virus are the ones who don't get vaccinated.

"No," the townsfolk say, "That is fake news. I trust in God; I don't trust you."

Sadly, many of these pious townsfolk succumbed to the virus. When they got to heaven, they were mad at God. They said, "Why didn't you care for us? Why didn't you answer our prayers? We put our trust in you, and you failed us."

But God answered, "I did care for you. I sent you doctors, nurses, scientists, healthcare workers and vaccines, but you refused them all. I am heartbroken at all the unnecessary suffering, which didn't have to happen."

Most often, God comes to us not in flashing displays of light and thunderous cacophonies, but in the everyday happenings in our world. Viruses happen due to the complex nature of biology, but God gifts human beings with the intellect and skills to adapt. Through God's agency, we have been given a gift: the COVID vaccine. As people of God, it is our duty to share the Good News of God's gracious gifts.


In July, over 200 clergy in Missouri (myself included) signed a letter authored by "Word and Way" (an award winning religious publication that has been around since 1896) that has been circulated in local newspapers across the state and publicized in other venues. A portion of that letter states:

"As Christian pastors and ministers in Missouri, we recognize the ongoing public health crisis facing our communities is growing more urgent. The COVID-19 delta variant is creating a spike in coronavirus cases, straining our state's hospitals, healthcare workers, and other medical resources. Local experts and officials are pleading for Missourians to get vaccinated against this devastating virus to alleviate these burdens and avoid unnecessary deaths. We add our voices to these cries . . . God's healing touch can be known through the miracles of modern medicine. We pray every eligible Missourian will get a vaccine so that we all can find renewed freedom from the ravages of COVID-19."

Getting the COVID vaccine (if you are able) is a simple way to serve God, by caring for the most vulnerable of God's children. I hope all will take this Good News to heart, and embrace the blessing God has given us.

CHURCH COUNCIL NOTES

from the July 20, 2021 meeting

- After Pastor Rick's opening prayer, Linda Neale gave a summary of Chapter 5 of "Piloting Church."
- LED lighting in the Education wing is scheduled to start this week.
- Mike Pierson still needs a few more members for the chancel renovation team, and to set a date for the first meeting.
- With regard to COVID-19, there is a new Public Health Advisory recommending that everyone, vaccinated or not, wear a mask indoors. At CUCC masks are optional for vaccinated adults and encouraged for unvaccinated adults. Even though our policy will not change at this time, the new Public Health Advisory will be posted by the church's entrances so our members and guests are aware of the new advisory.
- Pastor Rick's sabbatical is scheduled for the fall of 2022. He visited with Elena Huegel, Global Ministries Missionary to Chiapas, Mexico, during her recent visit to CUCC. Pastor Rick could possibly work four weeks in Chiapas as part of his sabbatical. He will submit an overall plan later.
- Mark Duncan was appointed Chair of the Outreach and Advocacy Ministry Team.
- Jeremy Sturm was hired as custodian. Jeremy started last week and Pastor Rick reports that Jeremy is doing an excellent job.
- The LODO Director's job description has been updated to replace the one in the previous LODO bylaws.
- The Vision Team asks that a member from each of the other ministry teams be present at their 8/5 meeting.
- A large Scout Troop has approach CUCC about possibly using the facility for their meetings. The troop is looking at other locations as well.
- There are 25 potential new members who are attending church regularly. Some have already volunteered to be part of church activities and outreach. Members are encouraged to wear nametags and to greet guests enthusiastically.
- Ministry Team Requests for the 2022 budget are due by 9/1 to the church treasurer.
- Council will serve dinner to VBS guests on 8/3.
- Pastor Rick reported that exciting things are being planned for the youth. Because there are so few high school age participants, 7th, 8th and 9th grades and high school students will remain in one group.
- On 8/10 the Fellowship & Hospitality Ministry Team will host an ice cream social in Fellowship Hall celebrating the 200th anniversary of Missouri statehood.

MEET OUR NEW CUSTODIAN!

CLERGY SABBATICAL

Clergy Compensation Guidelines call for Pastors to receive a three month Sabbatical after five years of service. This is part of Pastor Rick's Call Agreement with CUCC. On September 1, 2022, Pastor Rick will celebrate five years of ministry with CUCC, so the Church Council and the Clergy Personnel Committee are working to negotiate a Sabbatical Plan for Pastor Rick and CUCC. This Sabbatical will take place in the fall of 2022.

A Sabbatical is a time of rest for pastors, but it is not just about rest. It is also a time for education and focused ministry in other areas, to enhance the ministry in the parish when the pastor returns. It is a journey designed for growth; both for the pastor and for the congregation.

Pastor Rick has been talking with Global Ministries and our Mission Partners in Chiapas about the possibility of coordinating some time during his sabbatical with our Mission Partners. This would mean spending four to six weeks working in Chiapas on a special project designed to enhance our work in that area. Elena Huegel, our missionary to Chiapas, talked with Pastor Rick last month about some possible projects that could be coordinated. There are a total of four mission agencies in Chiapas that we work with through Global Ministries.

Part of this Sabbatical Time would be a Sabbatical for the Congregation, as well. While another pastor will be "filling in" during Pastor Rick's absence, the congregation will be going through an educational and service process similar to the one Pastor Rick is doing. The congregation will be learning more about Global Ministries, Chiapas, and the mission agencies we work with there; and will be participating in a special project to enhance all of our ministries. Sabbatical time is not just a Sabbatical for the pastor; it is a Sabbatical for the congregation, as well! Watch for more information as this time draws closer!

Council wants to make all congregants aware of the church's current financial position . As of June 30, 2021, we are behind in our Joyful Giving by \$30,623.19. The good news is that our expenses for the same time period are below the budgeted amount, but only by \$1,224.69. The other good news is that we have time to catch up, the rest of the year, in fact. This congregation has a history of responding to a challenge. This is another challenge that we are facing.

DESIGNATED FUNDS AT CUCC

Did you know that we have a Designated Fund at CUCC specifically for facility renovation projects and major repairs? The Building and Grounds Fund at CUCC was created in October, 2019, by the Church Council, by combining the former Building and Major Repairs Fund and the former Building Fund II. Since that time, donations have been received by several individuals, some of whom contribute regularly.

Monies from this fund are held in our investments with United Church Funds. We currently have a balance of over \$112,000 in this fund, but we also have several major repairs coming up in the next few years that will deplete this (including replacing 17 HVAC units and resealing our parking lot/driveway).

We also have a Scholarship Fund here at CUCC! This year, three applicants received \$1000 each from this fund. Monies from this fund are also invested with United Church Funds. Applications for the Scholarship Fund are received in the first quarter of each year (due by April 1 each year).

CUCC SCHOLARSHIP FUND AT WORK

The Columbia United Church of Christ Scholarship Fund is a new fund, created in October 2019, by repurposing the former Memorial Education Fund.

The original fund was established in 1972 by Professor H. H. Krusekopf as a memorial to his late wife, Nancy. Over the years, significant contributions to this fund were made in memory of Professor Krusekopf, Elsa Nagel, Seth Brandenburg, Wesley Kirchhoff, and Rachel Kirchhoff.

The new fund was established to enable continuing education endeavors among all members of this congregation, expanding the range of financial opportunities to continuing education in general, beyond the scope of ministry. Applications for scholarships are due by April 1 each year and are reviewed by a team consisting of the Finance & Stewardship Ministry Team Chair, the Nurture & Education Ministry Team Chair, the Vice Moderator of the Council, and the Pastor. All applicants must not only be church members, but be active in the life of the church.

This year, for our second class of recipients, we had three applicants: **Carissa Graves, Hayley Dennis, and Lindsey Oberle.** All three applicants were heartily approved. Each one received a \$1,000 scholarship to make their college education more affordable.

2021 CROP HUNGER WALK COMING UP!

The 2021 CROP (Communities Responding to Overcome Poverty) Hunger Walk is coming up! It is scheduled for September 19, 2021, at Stephens Lake Park.

The CROP Hunger Walk is one of the largest annual fundraising efforts of Church World Service, an interfaith organization formed in 1946 to address hunger and poverty issues around the world in the aftermath of World War II. At that time, seventeen Christian denominations came together "to do in partnership what none of us could hope to do as well alone." Currently, thirty-four faith groups participate in the work of Church World Service.

CROP Hunger Walks began in 1969 by youth who wanted to do something tangible to enhance the work of Church World Service. Teens in Bismarck, North Dakota and York County, Pennsylvania started the first CROP walk that year, and they have grown ever since. CUCC has been participating in CROP Walks here in Boone County for decades.

Last year, CUCC was the top fundraiser for the Columbia CROP Walk, raising \$2,761. **This year, our goal is to top \$3,000!** We will need your help to do it. The East Timor Education Foundation seeks to "make a world of difference" in the lives of the children of East Timor by building and equipping free schools, open to all children regardless of their religious or ethnic background. Global Ministries provides foundational support for this organization, and support for their ongoing efforts.

CUCC IS WORKING WITH WOMEN IN CHIAPAS

The International Service for Peace (SIPAZ) was founded in 1995 and is a permanent program supported by an international coalition of civil organizations and religious groups. SIPAZ plays a role in preventing socio-political violence in the communities of the Mexican state of Chiapas and the states of Oaxaca and Guerrero in southern Mexico. SIPAZ operates from a perspective of non-violence that stresses the construction of positive peace.

SIPAZ has identified three primary areas of work:

- Accompaniment of women and/or women's groups in rural areas of southern Mexico
- Generate increased attention on women's roles in peace processes
- Generate an integral gender perspective within SIPAZ's activities

Although many SIPAZ workshops are exclusively for women, the presence of men is also encouraged. Having men in the workshops creates a positive exchange of ideas between women and men, bringing interesting insights

to the discussions and reflections. Language is frequently a difficulty because not all SIPAZ staff persons speak the region's indigenous language, which is ch'ol, and many of the indigenous women do not speak Spanish. The project plans look for women in the communities who can help, both with the preparation and evaluation of the workshops and translation.

SIPAZ is just one of four mission agencies in Chiapas that are supported by CUCC through our relationship with Global Ministries.
