

This hymn represents the joining of two Thanksgiving hymns by nineteenth-century poet Henry Alford and eighteenth-century poet Anna Laetitia Aiken Barbauld. The creator of this combined form, which appeared early in the twentieth century, is not known.

- 28 Then they said to him, "What must we do to perform the works of God?"
- 29 Jesus answered them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent."
- 30 So they said to him, "What sign are you going to give us, then, so that we may see it and believe you? What work are you performing?
- 31 Our ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness, as it is written, 'He gave them bread from heaven to eat.' "
- 32 Then Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven.
- 33 For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." 34 They said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always."
- 35 Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.


