The Sacrament of Baptism

This is an open invitation for anyone who wishes to be baptized at this time. Remembering the Baptism of Christ, Pastor Rick will invite anyone who wishes to be baptized to come forward. If you would rather schedule a baptism at some point in the future, talk to Pastor Rick.

*The Sacrament of Baptism (Remembering your baptism)

Whether you have been baptized or not, you have been named and claimed by God. God blesses and redeems you just as you are.

Today, we celebrate the baptisms of everyone in the congregation: members and guests alike. Pastor Rick will be inviting everyone who wishes to come forward via the center aisle to recall being named and claimed by God and to remember their baptism.

Pastor Rick will give more instructions about how to proceed forward and participate in this ritual.

If you have not been baptized, you are welcome to participate, as well. Come forward and when you are told to “remember your baptism,” know that you are being reminded that God loves you and claims you, even if you have not participated in the Sacrament of Baptism.

On this day when we remember Christ’s baptism, we also remember our baptisms and our commitments to follow Jesus. We recall God’s saving acts through water; from the waters of Creation to the waters of the Ark of Salvation to the waters of Jesus’ baptism, when God broke loose into the world. As we remember these actions, we claim and remember our own baptisms and our call to serve Jesus.

We gather around this font of living water to celebrate God’s ever flowing, redeeming grace. We long to draw ever deeper from the well of God’s mercy. We celebrate the Spirit with us—refreshing us, renewing us, uniting us, affirming us. We celebrate God’s affirmation, “You are my beloved; with You I am well pleased.”

After everyone who wishes comes forward to participate, we will all rise and join together in our hymn, celebrating the ways God names us, claims us, and carries us through all the challenges of life.

Isaiah 42:1-9

1 Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights; I have put my spirit upon him; he will bring forth justice to the nations.

2 He will not cry out or lift up his voice or make it heard in the street;

3 a bruised reed he will not break, and a dimly burning wick he will not quench; he will faithfully bring forth justice.

4 He will not grow faint or be crushed until he has established justice in the earth, and the coastlands wait for his teaching.

5 Thus says God, the LORD, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people upon it and spirit to those who walk in it:

6 I am the LORD; I have called you in righteousness; I have taken you by the hand and kept you; I have given you as a covenant to the people, a light to the nations,

7 to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness.

8 I am the LORD; that is my name; my glory I give to no other, nor my praise to idols.

9 See, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth, I tell you of them.

Matthew 3:1-17

3 In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, 2 “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.”

3 This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said, “The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: ‘Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight.’ ”

4 Now John wore clothing of camel’s hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey.

5 Then Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region around the Jordan were going out to him,

6 and they were baptized by him in the River Jordan, confessing their sins.

7 But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming for his baptism, he said to them, “You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath?

8 Therefore, bear fruit worthy of repentance,

9 and do not presume to say to yourselves, ‘We have Abraham as our ancestor,’ for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham.

10 Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; therefore every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.

11 “I baptize you with water for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is more powerful than I, and I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.

12 His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and will gather his wheat into the granary, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.”

13 Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him.

14 John would have prevented him, saying, “I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?”

15 But Jesus answered him, “Let it be so now, for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness.” Then he consented.

16 And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw God’s Spirit descending like a dove and alighting on him.

17 And a voice from the heavens said, “This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.”
