

Remembering Your Baptisms

On this day when we remember Christ's baptism, we also remember our baptisms and our commitments to follow Jesus. We recall God's saving acts through water; from the waters of Creation to the waters of the Ark of Salvation to the waters of Jesus' baptism, when God broke loose into the world. As we remember these actions, we claim and remember our own baptisms and our call to serve Jesus.

We gather around this font of living water to celebrate God's everflowing, redeeming grace. We long to draw ever deeper from the well of God's mercy. We thank you, God for your gift of Creation, Salvation and Deliverance moving through the waters in the stories of our traditions and for your redeeming love in Jesus Christ, who was baptized by John in the water of the Jordan, became living water to a woman at the Samaritan well, washed the feet of the disciples and sent them forth to baptize all nations by water and the Holy Spirit. Eternal God; you have come to us in Jesus, given us new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and forgiven all our sins. Bless us now with the grace we need to fulfill what we have promised. Keep us faithful to our Savior Jesus Christ, forever and ever. Amen.



Joachim Neander was a dedicated, caring pastor of the Reformed Church in Düsseldorf, Germany. This was the most familiar of his fifty-six hymn texts, which were published along with many of his original tunes in 1680, the year of his death.



Influenced by the Oxford Movement, Matthew Bridges left the Church of England and became a Roman Catholic in 1848, the Year this confirmation hymn was published. He wrote numerous other prose and poetry works.

This anthem of the 1960s civil rights movement was frequently sung at mass meetings and marches. Several sources have been sung at mass meetings and marches. Several sources have been cited as its origins, including the spiritual "No more auction block for me" based on the tune known as Sicilian Maxiness; an old Baptist hymn "I'll Be All Right"; and part of the text from C. A. Tindley's gospel hymn "I'll Overcome Someday."
