Over the past 54 years, generations of Columbia United Church of Christ members and friends have gathered in this beloved Sanctuary to worship and glorify God. We have celebrated baptisms, confirmations, weddings, and funerals together here, embracing God's presence in these life moments while embracing our shared community.

But now, our beloved Sanctuary is in a state of physical decline. The carpet is stained and threadbare, the ceiling and walls are faded and stained, the chancel backdrop is ripped and peeling, and the windows are rattling in their frames. It is time for a facelift.

To that end, we have put together plans for a

NEW CENTURY SANCTUARY!

Details for this plan can be found on the CUCC Website, or in the brochure previously enclosed. The estimated cost for this project is \$150,000; any excess funds will be deposited in the Building & Grounds Designated Fund (invested with United Church Funds) for future building needs.

A Word From Your Inclusion and Affirmation Ministry Team

To complete this month's focus on Women and Girl's equality, we delve into a tough subject, child marriage.

Girls Not Brides is a partnership of over 1,600 organizations that fight to eliminate child marriage around the world. It defines child marriage as "any formal or informal union where one or both parties are under 18 years old." It reports that every minute 23 underage girls are forced into marriage.

Created in 2011, the vision was and is to create a world without child marriage where girls and women enjoy equal status with boys and men and are able to achieve their full potential in all aspects of their lives. Together, their goals are:

- Collaborate to prevent child marriage and to support girls who are already married.
- Amplify the voices of girls at risk; defend their right to health, education, and happiness.
- Raise awareness of the harmful impact of these unions.



Say NO to Child Marriage

- Facilitate learning and coordination between organizations to end this practice.
- Mobilize all necessary policy, financial and other support to end child marriage.

This is not just a third world problem. Child marriage happens in the United States, as well. If

you search "Marriage Age by State 2023," you will find that in the last 15 years 200,000 minors were married. Minimum age for marriage is set state by state.

In many states, the age for parental consent to marry varies depending on whether the child is male or female (consent for females is universally younger). The following states have no minimum age: California, Idaho, Maine, Michigan, Mississippi, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Rhode Island, Washington, West Virginia, and Wyoming. What about Missouri? Per "Showmerights.org", if one of the parties is younger than 18, parental consent is required. If an individual is younger than 15, they must obtain a court order.
