“Is Pride a Sin?”

As we move into the month of June, you are going to be hearing a lot about Pride, especially from the Queer Community. Every year, as Pride Month rolls around, there are those who are confused by its existence; there are even those who equate Pride Month to the “sin” of pride that is mentioned Biblically.

Jesus talks against being prideful in Mark 7:22. The book of Proverbs speaks against being prideful many times, including 11:22, 16:5, and 16:18, the famous phrase, “pride goes before destruction, a haughty spirit before a fall.”

However, the pride that is talked about Biblically and the Pride that is referred to in the affirmation of oppressed communities are two very different understandings of the word.

When Biblical authors talk about pride, they are referring to the act of oppressing others for selfish desires, usually power. When these Biblical authors talk about pride, they are referring to oppressors and tyrants, people who are cruel to others, people who sow dissention and injustice, people who use power as a weapon. ***The Biblical understanding of pride refers to those who think of themselves as more powerful and important than even God.***

Pride Month is just the opposite. Pride Month is about restoration of dignity, building up community, recognizing the inherent self-worth in one another. Pride Month was born out of oppression, birthed by people who were oppressed by a system that embodied the Biblical version of pride. Pride Month is about giving back to the Queer community what has been stolen from them by cruel oppressors. Pride Month is about acknowledging the infinite diversity of God’s glorious Creation.

In the television show, “Joan of Arcadia,” Joan asks God about pride and humility. Encouraging her to live into her potential, God tells Joan to have pride in her work and have pride in who she is. She questions God saying, “but I thought pride was a sin?” God tells her that being proud of who you are and how you are created in God’s image is not a sin; pride is only sinful when it separates you from your true potential.

According to the theologian Paul Tillich, the definition of “sin” is “separation.” Anything that separates you from God, your community, or your true self is a sin. Pride Month is not about separation; it is about affirmation. Denying a person’s true identity, refusing to use a person’s chosen pronouns, diminishing someone’s personhood because of how God created them- those actions fit the definition of sin. Affirming the identity of a person who has been created Queer by God cannot, by definition, be sinful.

It is interesting to note that when Pride celebrations first began, in 1970, there was much discussion about calling this movement “Gay Power” instead of “Gay Pride.” But organizer L. Craig Schoonmaker insisted on “Pride” over “Power.” He said that “not everyone can have power; but everyone can have Pride.

Pride Month is about restoration of dignity, affirmation of identity, and building a safe community; not just for the Queer community, but for everyone. This month, I pray we may all embrace this opportunity to live together in harmony.
