From the Pastor's Keyboard . . .

"Advent Joy"

"For I am about to create new heavens and a new earth; the former things shall not be remembered or come to mind. But be glad and rejoice forever in what I am creating, for I am about to create Jerusalem as a joy and its people as a delight. I will rejoice in Jerusalem and delight in my people; no more shall the sound of weeping be heard in it or the cry of distress. No more shall there be in it an infant who lives but a few days or an old person who does not live out a lifetime, for one who dies at a hundred years will be considered a youth, and one who falls short of a hundred will be considered accursed. They shall build houses and inhabit them; they shall plant vineyards and eat their fruit." -Isaiah 65:17-20

The prophet Isaiah, writing these words 600 years before Jesus, was living in a time of national turmoil. His country has been destroyed by a narcissistic tyrant and invading armies; his people had been enslaved and scattered to foreign lands, and the Temple, God's home on earth, had been destroyed. Things were about as bad as they could possibly be for the people of Israel living in that day and age.

Yet in this very circumstance, Isaiah relays this message of hope; that God is present in all things, no matter how difficult they get. But God is not just present; God is being active in Isaiah's world, creating newness in the midst of desolation. Even when human things were darker than imaginable, God was doing new things. Not just maintaining, but doing something new. God is creating new heavens and new earth, even when the people of Israel were wallowing in despair.

The prophet Isaiah is relaying this message to us as well. No matter how depressing things get in our own personal or communal lives, God is there; not just getting us by, but empowering us to do new things. God is not just about maintaining; God is about progressing. New things are always happening when God is in charge.

What keeps us from embracing God's new heavens and new earth? Usually, that boils down to fear. People in power are afraid of losing power, and people who are comfortable are afraid of losing their comfort. Fear builds walls, fear fortifies fences, and fear causes people to retreat into maintenance mode, rather than growing into God's vision of the future.

But not here at CUCC! We are joyful people, not fearful people; and joyful people grow into God's new heavens and new earth. Joyful people don't just maintain what is, they envision what will be; and then go for it! This is us. We are joyful people. We have vision. We have hope. We are God's new earth.

I see this in so many areas of CUCC. Our music program, which has grown greatly this year under Mike's incredible leadership, is an embodiment of joy. Our Confirmation Class is growing and learning and embracing new ways of faith expression. Our Quilters are growing in number. Our Sunday School has had incredible numbers this past year. Thirteen new members have joined our congregation this year, brought in by our inclusive identity and our expressive standards of welcome.

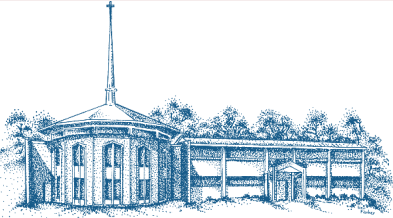

SOLARIZE COLUMBIA UPDATE - CONGREGATIONAL MEETING ON DECEMBER 7

The CUCC Council, at its November meeting, unanimously approved a motion to proceed with installment of solar panels on the church. Many thanks to all who have studied, discussed, and prayed about this potential investment in our church's future.

There will be a congregational meeting immediately after worship on December 7 to consider the following motion:

"The CUCC Council introduces a motion that the congregation of Columbia United Church of Christ enter into a contract with Dogwood Solar to purchase and install a solar power generating system at a net cost of \$100,533, and that the expense of this purchase be taken from the undesignated CUCC investment accounts with United Church Funds. We also direct that money received in federal direct pay IRS credits from this purchase (\$40,213) be reinvested into our United Church Funds accounts to replace the money used for the initial purchase. Furthermore, we direct that the Council enter into a loan agreement with the City of Columbia for up to \$30,000 at 3% interest for five years to offset the cost of this system, and that the money received from the city loan be reinvested into our United Church Funds accounts to replace the money used for the initial purchase."

The Columbia UCC Council meeting was called to order at 6:32 p.m. on October 21, 2025 by Jerry Kiesling. Pastor Rick opened with a prayer. Present: Jerry Kiesling, Ted Dachroeden, Mary Lorber, Ashley Ramirez, Judi Privitt, Mahree Skala, Edie Diel, Rick Oberle, Deborah Birkes, Christine Staelens, Kristin Veteto and guest Corinne Remeika. Ted Dachroeden made a motion to approve the agenda with a second from Edie Diel. The motion passed. Christine Staelens made a motion to approve the September minutes. Second by Mahree Skala. Motion passed.

Unfinished Business

- * New Light for Sign: No updates.
- * Nominating Committee for 2025: Considering Corinne Remeika for Vice Moderator. No developments on Finance and Stewardship chair.
- * Solar Columbia Update: Installing company will have a site visit on 10/30 at 4:30 to get measurements and to refine the preliminary plan. 11/04 the company will come to have a proposal meeting with us. On 11/16, Team Earth will sponsor a Lunch & Learn to focus on Solarize Columbia. Feedback will be shared and brought back to Council during the November meeting for an official decision. Would be more financially feasible to submit our decision to Solarize Columbia by 12/31. Potential congregational meeting date would be 12/07 to finalize the council's decision on this.

NATIONAL SPECIAL EDUCATION DAY

On December 2 each year, the nation comes together to celebrate National Special Education Day. This day celebrates the anniversary of the signing of the Individuals with Disabilities Act. This act was signed by President Ford on December 2, 1975, and was made into a law that guarantees a free and appropriate public education to children who are eligible. This also guarantees students with disabilities inclusive and non-restrictive classrooms in order to learn alongside their non-disabled peers, gives them the accommodations they need, and helps special education programs further develop.

As you may or may not know, the current administration has recently laid off 466 employees in the Department of Education, due to the government shutdown. This means only *three* people are left to take charge of the Office of Special Education to oversee the services of over 8 million children. While this news is certainly disheartening, here's what we can do to help:

- * Contact your local representatives to encourage them to reverse these firings!
- * Contact the Presidential Administration to restore the Office of Special Education's staff who protect students' rights and make sure that the states follow the special education laws.
- * Thank a special education teacher! While the government is trying to harm a vulnerable population, special education teachers are going to continue to do the hard work for their students whom they love.

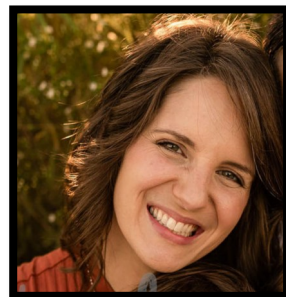

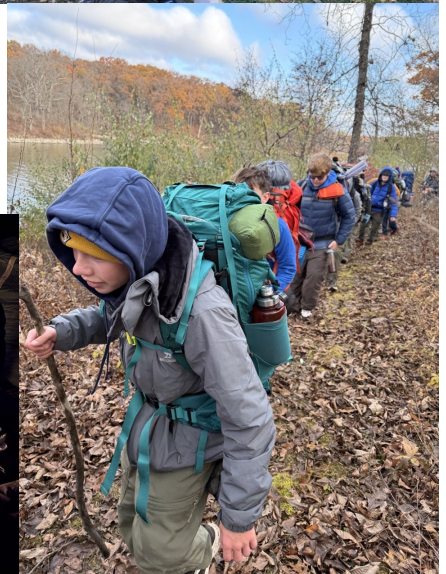
